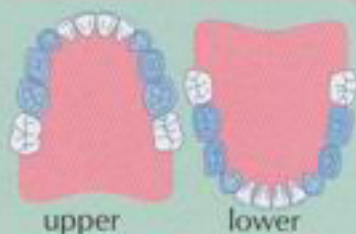

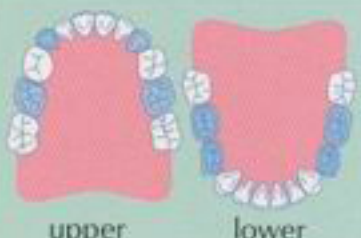

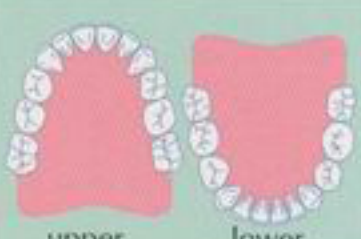

Your teeth and what they do

Each of your teeth is different because they perform different functions to help you eat.



Incisors (front teeth)
-have sharp, thin edges
for cutting food.



Canines/Cuspids
(corner teeth)
-designed for cutting and
tearing food.



Premolars/bicuspid
(back teeth)
-have cusps for grasping
and tearing food.



Molars
(back teeth)
-have short, blunt cusps
for grinding solid food.
